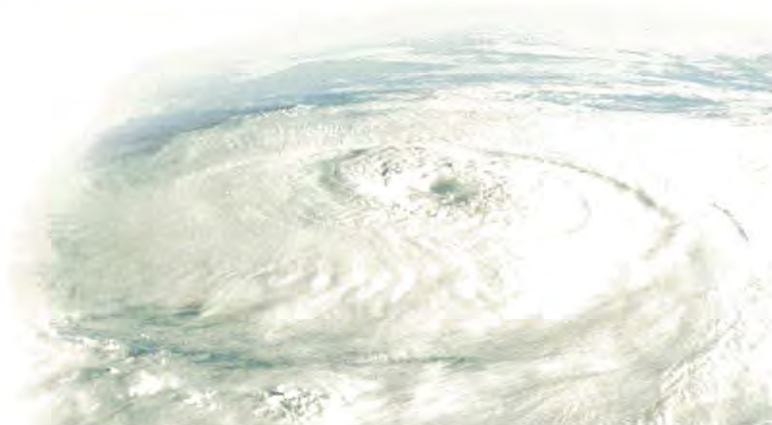

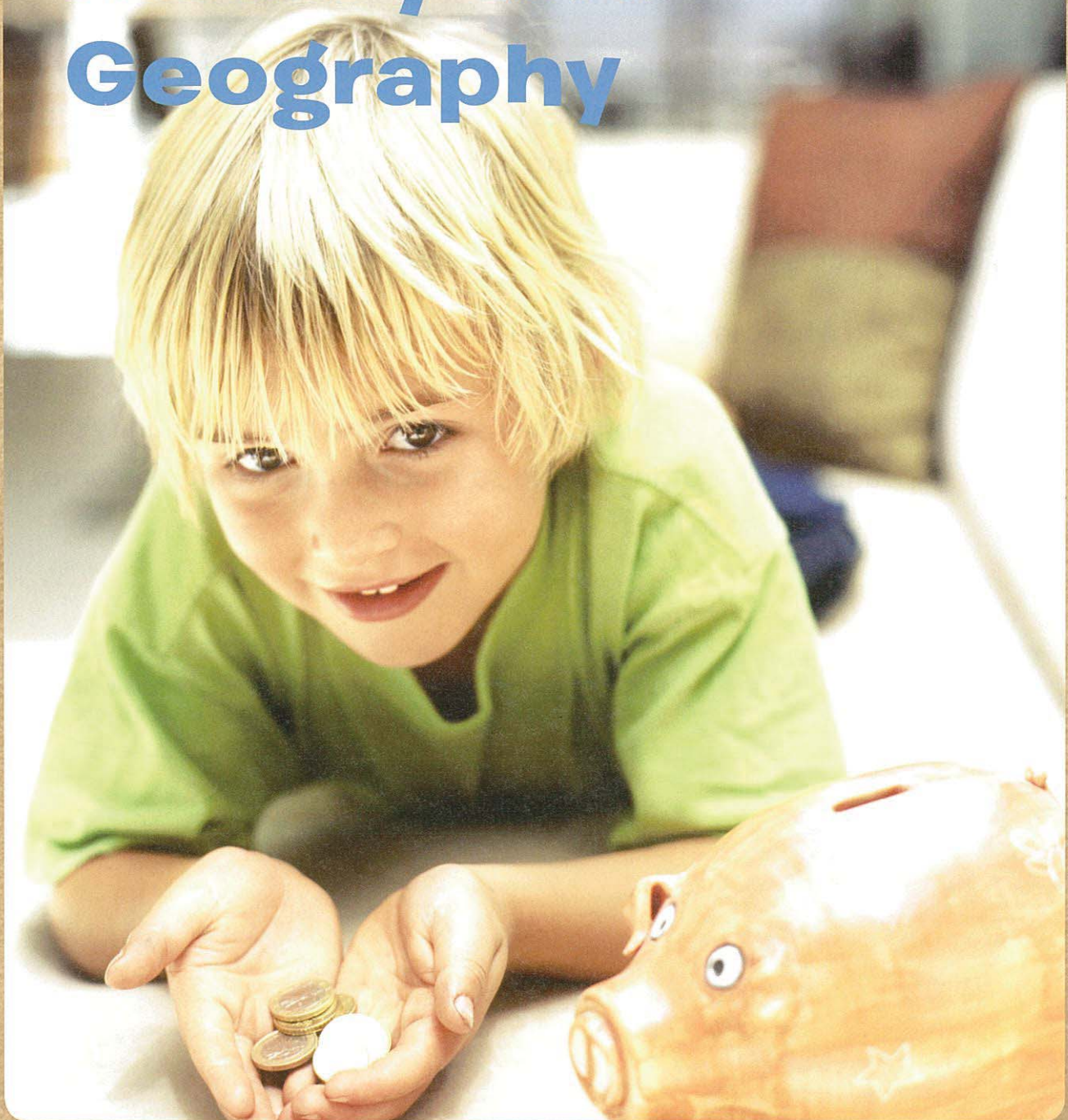

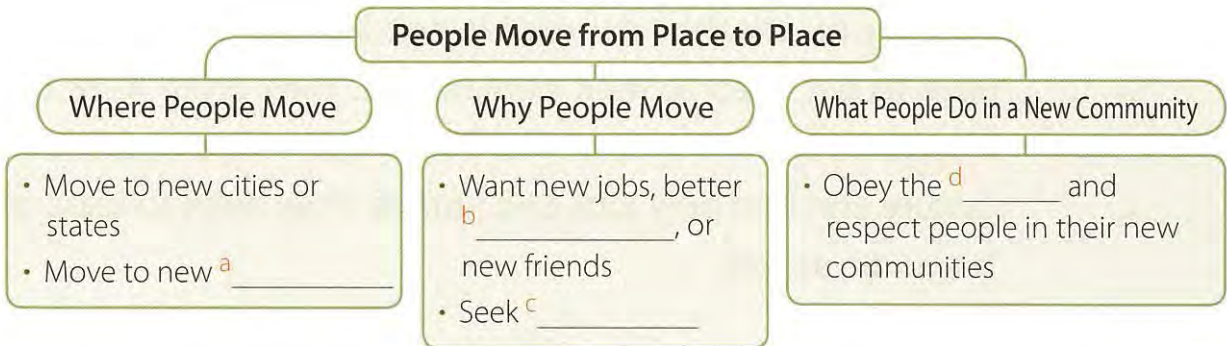

The United States is a nation of immigrants. People immigrate to the U.S. from all over the world.

In the early 1900s, many immigrants came from Europe. They sailed on ships across the Atlantic Ocean. They often arrived at Ellis Island in New York Harbor. In New York Harbor, the Statue of Liberty greeted them. For many immigrants, “Lady Liberty” was the first thing they saw in America. It was a symbol of freedom to these immigrants.

In the 1960s, many immigrants came from Asia. They often arrived at Angel Island in San Francisco Bay.

Moving to another country is not always easy. Immigrants have to get used to their new homes. They often have to start a **completely** new way of life. They have to learn about a new culture and find new jobs and homes. They need to learn a new language as well.

Some immigrants live with the same ethnic group. Ethnic neighbors can help them get used to their new country.

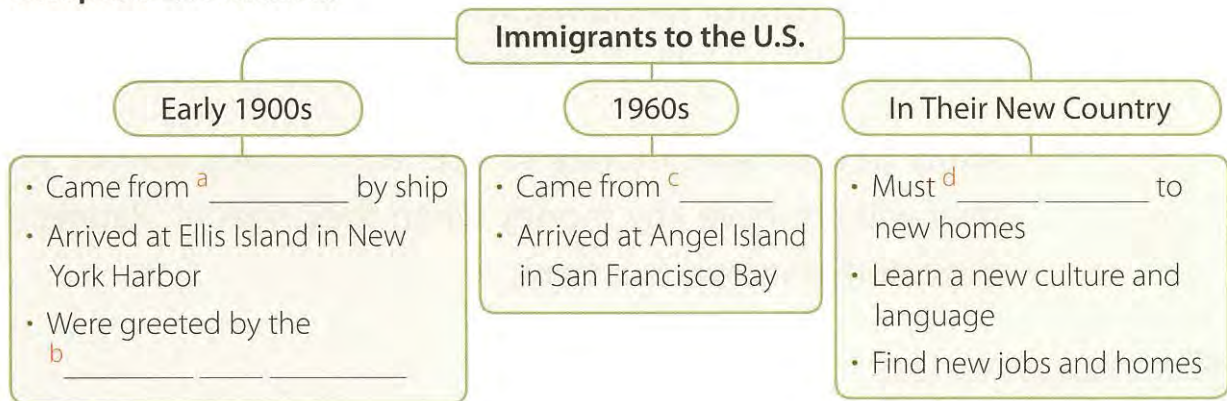
